



The North Coast Stormwater Coalition

The primary goals of the North Coast Stormwater Coalition are to reduce stormwater pollution and runoff through education and implementation of Best Management Practices, while at the same time improving stormwater management and meeting required regulations in a cost-effective, efficient manner.

The Coalition was established by the City of Eureka in 2004 in order to provide a forum for municipalities implementing Storm Water Management Plans (SWMPs) under the National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) Phase II Storm Water program (cities under 100,000 in population are required by the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) to obtain permits and implement stormwater programs).

Since its inception, the Coalition has included governmental agencies, nonprofit groups, and businesses. The members meet the second Wednesday of every month to discuss local and regional stormwater concerns and projects.
